Let's take a look at some more of her titles and see how we can follow her good example.


Prophet Muḥammad (ṣ) has said: "Fatima is the leader of the women of the world."

This tells us that she is the best role model for all Muslims, particularly Muslim women.

We can see some of her characteristics through the meanings of her titles. One of her titles is Siddiqah, which means the truthful. Sayyidah Faṭimah (a) not only spoke the truth, but stood up for the truth when others tried to cover it with falsehood.

It is very important to be honest and to always tell the truth.

Another title is Abidah, which means the one who worships. Worshipping and remembering Allah is a foundational part of being a Muslim, and Sayyidah Faṭimah (a) was the most pious woman.

There are many sayings and hadith about Sayyidah Fatimah (a) that tell us what kind of person she was, and that show her characteristics.

- Let's learn how our Noble Prophet, Prophet Muhammad (s), describes Sayyidah Fatimah (`a) and what that tells us about her status.
- In one hadith, Prophet Muhammad (s) says:
- "Fatimah is a part of me; whoever hurts her has hurt me, and whoever pleases her has pleased me."
